

Submission via e-mail is preferred, and should be accompanied by a cover letter stating mailing and e-mail addresses, phone and fax numbers, affiliation and academic rank. Since we are contemplating publishing selected papers, submission of papers that are not being considered for publication elsewhere is most welcome.
